

## CITADEL WORLDWIDE MULTI-STRATEGY H4 RETAIL HEDGE FUND

### INVESTMENT OBJECTIVE AND POLICY

The Citadel Worldwide Multi-Strategy H4 Retail Hedge Fund is a multi-strategy, multi-asset class, hedge fund which has the objective of generating consistent, uncorrelated returns.

The fund will invest in different asset classes and apply different strategies in order to maximise decorrelation. The portfolio may invest worldwide and shall have the maximum flexibility to vary allocations between local and international markets and between sectors, to reflect the changing economic and market conditions.

The commitment approach will be used to ensure that leverage is contained within 200% of the total net asset value of the fund relative to the market.

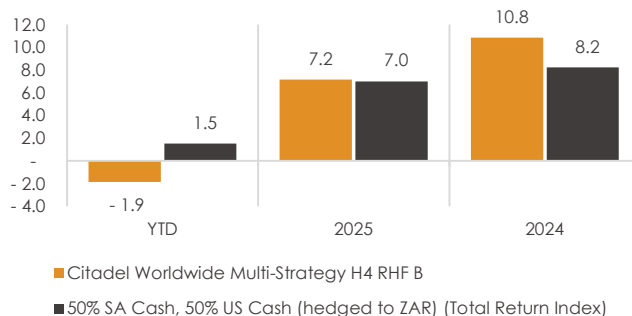

### FUND COMMENTARY

Global financial markets experienced a challenging environment during Q1-2026, shaped by heightened geopolitical and macroeconomic risks. Escalating tensions in the Middle East disrupted oil and gas supply, contributing to higher energy prices and reinforcing upside inflation risks. Against this backdrop, market conditions shifted toward a more pronounced risk-off environment across asset classes. The MSCI World Index (in US dollars) was down 3.6% for the quarter, dragged lower primarily by weakness in US equity markets, with the S&P 500 Index and the Nasdaq Composite falling 4.4% and 7.0% respectively. European equities were comparatively less affected, with the MSCI Europe Index (in US dollars) down 2.8%. Emerging market equities were broadly unchanged with the MSCI Emerging Markets Index (in US dollars) recording a marginal decline of 0.2% for the quarter, despite falling 13.1% in March. Global bond markets reflected shifting inflation dynamics and monetary policy expectations. US government bonds provided relative stability, with the Bloomberg US Treasury Index broadly flat as yields declined toward quarter-end.

South African financial markets moved largely in line with global developments. The FTSE/JSE All Share Index reached record levels earlier in the quarter before ending 0.6% lower, as gains in basic materials shares (+7.5%) were offset by declines in the technology sector (-22.3%). The FTSE/JSE All Bond Index declined 3.5%, reflecting the broader global risk-off environment. The rand strengthened against the US dollar earlier in the period but weakened as global risk sentiment deteriorated, ending the quarter 3.3% weaker. Against this backdrop, the Citadel Worldwide Multi-Strategy H4 Retail Hedge Fund was down 1.9% for the quarter, bringing the 1-year return to 5.7%. The fund remains well diversified across three distinctly different strategies, both locally and globally. The fund continues to adhere to its policy.

#### About the manager, trustee/custodian, scheme and administrator

This portfolio was established by H4 Collective Investments (RF) (Pty) Ltd, registration number 2002/009140/07 (“the manager”), of The Citadel, 15 Cavendish Street, Claremont, 7708 (telephone +27 21 670 9100) as part of the H4 Collective Investments Scheme (“the scheme”). The trustee of the scheme is the Standard Bank of South Africa Limited, registration number 1962/000738/06, of 9th Floor, Standard Bank Centre, 5 Simmonds Street, Johannesburg, 2001 (telephone +27 11 636 9111/2). The administrator of the scheme is Apex Fund Services South Africa Limited, registration number 1981/009543/07, of Apex House 1, River Park, Gloucester Road, Mowbray, 7700 (+27 21 681 8000).

#### About the investment manager

The manager has appointed Citadel Investment Services Proprietary Limited, registration number 1996/006847/07 (“Citadel”), as the investment manager of the portfolio. Citadel is licensed as a hedge fund financial services provider in terms of the Financial Advisory and Intermediary Services Act, 2002.

#### Legal structure of the portfolio

The portfolio is established as a trust by way of a supplemental deed to the main deed of the scheme, executed by the manager and the trustee/custodian and approved by the Financial Sector Conduct Authority in terms of the Collective Investment Schemes Control Act, 2002. The assets of the portfolio may be held by the trustee/custodian or by another bank or by the nominee of the portfolio's prime broker.

#### Risk warning

### Calculation of the NAV and price

The value of participatory interests is calculated on a NAV basis. The price of participatory interests is calculated by dividing the NAV by the number of participatory interests in issue. The portfolio is available via certain LISPs, who levy their own fees. Prices are published monthly on the MDD.
